**ProcellaCOR EC kills 16 species of water plants, including native plants.**

A recently-issued injunction halted the application of ProcellaCOR EC in Lake George, which covers more than twice the acreage of Chautauqua Lake. Plaintiffs in the lawsuit cited their concerns about the application process AND their concerns about the potential harmful effects of the chemical.
